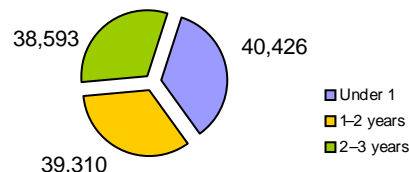
In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:3 for 2 weeks to 18 months; 1:4 for infants to 6 years (maximum 2 infants); 1:5 for 12 to 30 months; 1:7 for 24 to 36 months

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

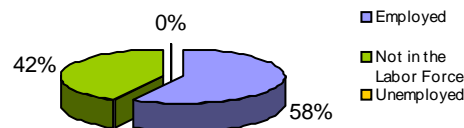
1:6 with a maximum of 4 children under the age of 12 months allowed
