An average of 21,744 of children 0–3 are served per month by the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF)

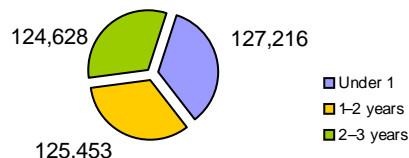
In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:4 for children between the ages of birth to 2.5 years; 1:8 for children between the ages of 2.5 and 3 years

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

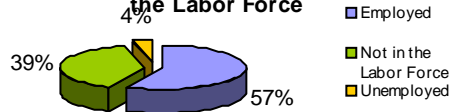
1:6 (with no more than 4 under the age of 30 months, and no more than 2 of these under the age of 18 months)
