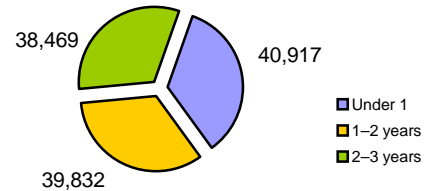

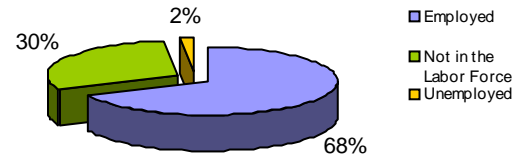

In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:4 for birth to 8 months; 1:6 for 9 to 18 months; 1:8 for 18 months to 3 years
(State Licensing Regulations)

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:6 (with no more than 4 children under 2 years, and of these, no more than 2 children under 1 year)
Three (3) additional school-age children are allowed.
(State Licensing Regulations)

In Group Home Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

2:12 (with no more than 8 children under 3 years, and of these, no more than 4 children under 1 year)
